Robert Sarly, President and Abby Raeder, Executive Director, besides creating a very nice space for contemporary art viewing have already started off with a very ambitious schedule of shows and events, some of which my wife Karen and I have already taken advantage of. In the past few weeks we have attended a film showing and discussion, a jazz quartet performance, and an art opening. It's an arts center with a lot of potential, but it will need more than just the local community to support it.
